## METAL MANIPULATION

The art of fold-forming uses the inherent elasticity of metal to create unique three-dimensional forms. The students will cut a copper shape and create folds by hammering the metal. Using a propane torch the metals will be heated and opened to reveal a fold. The class will start with basic line folds then T folds and cross folds. The students will be able to do several pieces that can be turned in pendants, earrings or a bracelet
